EXG in India Executes Transport of Complex Cargo

Earlier this year, Indian members, Express Global Logistics (EXG) executed the transportation and barging of 191mt of complex cargo from Walchand Nagar in Pune to Thiruvananthapuram in Kerala for a client's GOI project.

The initial part of the journey was inland, from Walchand Nagar to the Ulwe jetty at a distance of 782km via 2 hydraulic trailers. Barges were then used to transport the cargo from Ulwe to Kollam covering a distance of 720nmi. EXG completed the journey with a final inland transportation from Kollam Port to the final site in Thiruvananthapuram (110km).

EXG successfully transported the following pieces:

- A Contraction Section & Settling Chamber Weldment: 9.9 x 5.7 x 5.8m / 129mt. Transported on 10 hydraulic axles.
- A Silencer Section Assembly: 5.2 x 5.9 x 6.1m / 62mt. Transported on 8 hydraulic axles plus drop deck.
- 100 Packages of Accessories: Moved on 3 mechanical trailers by road.

The project required the use of 2 hydraulic trailers to move the OOG cargo along a preselected road that had utility and power lines lifted and moved out of the convoy's path. The EXG team put together a coordinated effort to secure several permits ahead of the transportation as well as managing electric shut-downs and numerous tree pruning along the route. Civil work was conducted at multiple locations to ensure the oversized cargo did not face any height restrictions.

Inclement weather, particularly the onset of cyclone Tauktae, increased the complexity of the project considerably. Once the cyclone passed, the EXG engineering team conducted a technical and risk assessment to convince authorities to permit barging during a torrential downpour. Due to the harsh monsoons, the jetty even had to be reconstructed at Ulwe. The barge had to return to anchorage due to the intermittent foul weather and at Kollam Port, rapid ballasting was also required to stabilize the barge at the time of unloading. The onward movement from Kollam to the site was also challenging due to the demolition and reconstruction of the port gate.

Despite the size of the cargo and distance covered to deliver the cargo, the project was executed smoothly. Unexpected challenges, like the harsh weather conditions and the strict lockdowns, were dealt with deftly by EXG's experienced professionals to ensure the safe and timely delivery of the cargo.

Anker Logistica Handle Shipment of 17 Flexsteel Pipe Coils

Anker Logistica y Carga (members in Colombia) have been handling flexsteel pipe projects for over 7 years and have developed a truly organised and symbiotic relationship with suppliers, local truckers, terminals and carriers. They know the shipper's and consignee's needs completely and can translate these into the logistics world very clearly. Their great allies in carriers, terminals and trucking companies also make the best effort to bring the cargo to the final destination.

Andrea Manrique at Anker explains; "During 2021, we handled a flexsteel shipment with a total of 17 coils and their accessories from the USA to Colombia. The coils are created to be the most efficient and high quality way to transport gas and oil for any resources field and give excellent results to scouting companies.

One of the biggest challenges during this shipment was fixed vessel departures and local origin transportation because after all the new logistics processes post Covid-19, we don't have the same truck availability and on-time deliveries. However, we made sure all the origin processes were on time and were proactive to catch the vessel's cut off and fulfil our client expectations.

For this particular shipment, the cargo was delivered at origin just with four days before the cargo cut-off but our PCN partners at LEMAN made extra efforts to make the delivery and got extra time with the terminal, making surveyor origin processes almost at the same time that vessel was loading the cargo. We also had a special challenge during the loading process as the supplier could not send us all the rigging materials but with coordination with the terminal staff and vessel Captain, we were able to sort the issue and continue the shipment. After the booking was confirmed for one terminal in Colombia and in the middle of transit time, we had to change the unloading port because the original destination had 5 bulk carriers trying to unload and there would not be a window. So, we successfully managed the change of destination and moved the entire logistics process.

We coordinated with the new terminal for the unloading process and made sure time, personal, cranes and equipment were ready and available for the cargo's arrival in Colombia to make the direct unloading to trucks. Once the customs processes were completed, the cargo could be transported to the final destination. As the coils were higher than height restrictions on Colombian highways, we had to carefully calculate the route to make the delivery."

Despite all these issues, the shipment was successful with good cooperation, high quality communication and excellent customer service.

Detailed Planning Means Success for C.H. Robinson

The project logistics experts at C.H. Robinson recently assisted their client with transporting equipment to Belgium for a new propane dehydrogenation (PDH) plant.

The extensive project involved 7 large modules, 7 breakbulk pieces and 31 containers. To make sure nothing was overlooked, C.H. Robinson developed a comprehensive method statement which included detailed drawings, loading & discharge sequencing, equipment lists, aerial photos, vessel specifications, analysis of port capabilities, route plans, risk assessment, timelines and more.

Firstly, self-propelled modular transporters (SPMT) were used to move the modules, one of which measuring $60.1 \times 10.3 \times 12.5$ m and weighing 473.15mt, a few hundred yards from the fabrication shop to the port where they were stored on stands to await departure.

Once the vessel arrived at the port, all the cargo was loaded onto a single heavy lift vessel for the transport from Spain to Antwerp. The bulk of the cargo was stowed below deck in the ship's hold with the two largest modules stowed on deck and shrink wrapped to protect them from the elements during ocean transit.

Once berthed in Antwerp, the cargo was discharged under the watchful eye of C.H. Robinson's onsite project manager. The containers and breakbulk cargo were trucked from the terminal to the jobsite but the modules required a different solution due to their large size and the obstacles along the route. Therefore, C.H. Robinson arranged for all modules to be transported via barge to the final site, using SPMT's to load and unload. In all, a total of four barge trips were required to move the seven modules.

Fortune International Transport Load Fully Chartered Vessel

Italian members, Fortune International Transport have loaded a fully chartered vessel with 10 OOG pieces (diameters over 7m and heights of over 5m).

Paolo Federici at Fortune explains; "We who are of a certain age remember, with nostalgia, the times when to load a ship, it was necessary to know how to prepare a suitable stowage plan. We had a list of crates, cages and units of the most diverse sizes and each package has its own peculiarities (not stackable, not loadable on deck, to be handled only with the forklift, to be fixed on board, etc) so it was necessary to make precise calculations to load everything correctly. We also had to take into account the heavy weights to properly balance the ship.

Back then, there were no schools that taught the art of shipping. Of course, having done scientific studies could be of great help - knowing mathematics and geometry, calculating volumes, evaluating the incidence of weight per sqm etc. Everything was very important and you could not go wrong. A wrong calculation meant that, at the time of boarding, a certain box did not enter the space provided and everything had to be done all over again. Then someone had a brilliant idea - if the packaging becomes all the same, loading a ship becomes child's play and therefore, the container was born. However, there is still cargo that cannot travel in containers - pieces that have exceptional measurements or weights. So, for these expeditions, we must go back to the shipping artists!

Fortune International Transport is one of these shipping artists and this is the latest in a long series of projects we've handled managing plants. This project involved around ten packages with OOG measurements. Once they arrive in Italy (they will disembark in Chioggia), they will continue to Mantua and then make the final stretch by road on special trucks, duly escorted and with the suitable permits, traveling at night. We will need to dismantle traffic lights and remove other obstacles along the route.

The photos to the right show the loading. The ship was entirely chartered by Fortune International Transport and the loading plan was planned and studied in our Milan office, just as it once was."
