Goodrich partners with Afriguide to deliver OOG Shell Cans

PCN members, Goodrich Central Asia partnered with Afriguide Logistics to move 12 oversized units of shell cans from South Africa all the way to Kazakhstan. The largest units had dimensions of 7.9 x 4.2 x 4.2 and weighed 61mt with the smaller units at 45mt.

Sanju K. Mani at Goodrich explains: "The Covid-19 situation delayed the production of the project which was supposed to be ready in April or May 2020 but was finally ready in September. The Afriguide Logistics team are our 'go-to' partner in South Africa and as always, they did a great job of arranging the trucks and ocean freight to Mersin in Turkey.

At Mersin, the units were loaded on the waiting trucks to embark on the 5,000km journey to Kazakhstan via Georgia and Azerbaijan. The offloading of these beauties, which came from a pleasant +30° to a freezing -25°, was also handled under the scope of Goodrich."

CN members, EZ Link in Taiwan and Noatum Project Cargo (formerly Actanis) in South Korea have joined forces for the successful handling and delivery of 36 units of cable drums.

The cable drums were shipped from Masan in Korea to Taichung in Taiwan via breakbulk vessel then onto the client's door in Changhua. The largest drums each measure 375 x 235 x 378cm and weigh 16,025kg.

Willie Tseng from EZ Link says: "Under DDP terms, our project team arranged the customs clearance before receiving the cargo under hook from the vessel and transporting it with forklifts to the port's temporary storage area. Low-bed trailers then carried the drums from the port to the job site where we again used forklifts for the offloading. The whole operation was successfully accomplished safely and on time."

Stanley Kim at Noatum South Korea concludes: "We all know that no business can be handled without trust especially when dealing with project cargo and the mutual trust between PCN members was key in the success of this project cargo movement."



The cargo was loaded onto an ocean vessel at the Port of Antwerp using the ship's cranes and safely secured by



chains in the vessel hold. After 36 days on the water, the ship arrived at the Port of Houston and the pieces were unloaded and onto truck trailers for the road transportation. Step deck trailers were used in order to ensure clearance throughout the journey.

24 days and 3,800km later, the pieces arrived at the site in Fort McMurray in

Alberta. The largest load on the road measured 42.5 x 5.5 x 5.3m and weighed 140.6mtn.

C.H. Robinson's suite of services helped make this multimodal project possible with a 30% saving for the client from what was originally quoted. The cargo arrived safely and on time as usual.

C.H. Robinson Project Cargo for Power Plant

The project logistics experts at C.H. Robinson recently undertook a project to transport equipment from Bulgaria and Ireland to California for a power plant company.

In Bulgaria, the gasifier and stairs were divided into nine breakbulk pieces which were then loaded onto an ocean vessel for the 48-day journey across the water to California. The largest piece measured 12.55 x 3.29 x 3.45m and weighed 11.9mtn. Once on land, the cargo was loaded onto trucks and transported 460km to the company's plant.

Meanwhile in Ireland, machine parts were loaded onto 11 x flat-racks, 7 x open-tops, and 4 x high-cubes and shipped across the ocean. A total of 265.6mtn and 990cbm was transported from Ireland and arrived 40 days later.

The C.H. Robinson team secured ocean transports, organised trucking to and from the ports, arranged necessary cranes, secured permits & road escorts, attended to the required customs brokerage and ensured all necessary paperwork was in order. The project went off without a hitch and in a safe and timely manner thanks to the experts at C.H. Robinson and their suite of services.

C.H. Robinson provides safe transport from Canada to Argentina

The project logistics specialists and surface transportation team at C.H. Robinson recently arranged a shipment of large equipment from



Quebec in Canada to Argentina for a long-time client.

Five truckloads carrying compressor components, a separator, an expansion tank and crates travelled over 900km from Quebec to the port in Baltimore, Maryland. The largest piece was a compressor on a skid which required a stretch double drop trailer due to its size, measuring 13.7 x 3.8 x 3.7m and weighing 35mtn.

While the equipment was covered for protection throughout the journey, the tarping on the two largest pieces ripped during the trucking. C.H. Robinson's team rectified the situation by quickly arranging for the pieces to be re-tarped before they were transferred to MAFIs.

Once at the port, the pieces were carefully lifted by crane and forklift from the truck's trailers and placed onto the MAFIs which were used to roll the cargo on and off the ocean vessel. The vessel sailed by a regular liner service and arrived safely at the port in Argentina according to the schedule. In total, the shipment had a volume of 361.6cbm and weighed over 59mtn.

Careful planning ensures successful LNG project delivery for C.H. Robinson



C.H. Robinson Project Logistics recently undertook a door-to-door project for a long-time valued customer. A total of 800cbm of crated liquid natural gas (LNG) equipment needed to be moved from a supplier in Poland to the site in Mexico. The largest piece on this heavy lift move was a refrigeration unit, which measured $7.35 \times 2.65 \times 5.31$ m and weighed 20.3mtn.


The LNG equipment was first trucked to a nearby barge terminal where cranes were waiting to load the cargo. From there, the equipment travelled via river to a port on the coast of the Baltic Sea where it was offloaded from the barge and reloaded onto a coaster vessel for the sea transport to Antwerp where the pieces were then transferred onto an ocean vessel bound for Mexico.

The cargo arrived at the port in Mexico approximately 35 days later and was trucked to a storage yard as the site was not yet ready to receive the cargo. The C.H. Robinson team had arranged the storage area ahead of time, locating an area with ample space and security.

C.H. Robinson utilised their suite of services to coordinate the multiple elements required for this job, including surface transportation, securing the correct permits and arranging barges, coaster vessels, cranes and the storage space. Careful planning was essential in order to avoid delays.





Shipway handles Dryer Chambers from Argentina to Peru



Shipway (members in Argentina) recently handled the shipping of 2 spray dryer chambers plus accessories. Their scope of work involved many areas of services including packing, stuffing, trucking and ocean freight.

"Shipway organised and carried out the packing, including VCI anti-corrosion film, silica gel and heat sealing, for the chambers protection, as well as seaworthy tarps, lashing and securing materials for the seafreight transport. The stuffing works were carefully planned to optimise time and space availability. Given the cargo dimensions and plant height limitations, the chambers were loaded in the street, which demanded crane positioning outdoors, obtaining necessary permits with local authorities, insurance cover and security escorts. The chambers were lashed and secured with 5tn straps and timber blocks with the accessories stuffed in 40' DV and HC containers inside."

"Once inspected by in-plant customs officers, the cargo was moved to port using a 4-axle lowbed trailer for the 40'FR FCL and 2 standard drayage trucks for the standard FCL containers. Upon arrival, they were loaded to the vessel to set sail for Peru.

The cargo arrived in Callao on time as per the planned schedule with everything ready to comply with customs formalities and continue to the final destination with no delay. The oversized cargo was moved from the port at dawn on a ten-hour trip with a transit through Lima city. All cargo was received at the final destination in good order and perfect condition."

Through this project in Brazil, several small ceramics factories have switched their fuel production from native forest wood to agricultural and industrial biomass residues. The carbon credits revenue is reinvested in social. environmental and economic benefits for workers and the community. The ceramics are located in Brazil, in the state of Ceará in the northeast region of the country. The contribution to sustainability is being monitored by applying the Sustainability Monitoring Plan, described on Section G of the Gold Standard

The Hydrologic Water Project in Cambodia

In Cambodia, many of the population boils water on wood fire stoves to make it safe for drinking, while some may not use any sort of treatment at all. The smoke the fires give off can have very harmful effects on the respiratory health of women and children in particular and drinking unpurified water can lead to illnesses particularly among young children. This project sells locally made Ceramic Water Purifiers (CWP) at subsidised costs to Cambodian citizens. With a filter in their home, families no longer need to boil their water to make it safe to drink. This reduces indoor air pollution from wood burning and reduces pressure on Cambodia's vulnerable forests. The CWP purifiers are beginning to make a profound difference to those who need it most.
